Violinist Caroline Goulding, Winner of the Avery Fischer Award, Comes to the Wisconsin Union Theater with a Stradivarius

For 92 seasons of classical music, the Wisconsin Union Theater has prided itself on presenting the greatest new players; it does so again with [Caroline Goulding](#), winner of the Avery Fischer Award, who will be playing the General Kyd Stradivarius in two concerts as part of the 2011-2012 Concert Series. The first is a solo recital on Thursday, November 3, 2011, 7:30 pm. The program includes Mozart, Sonata in G Major, K. 301; Enescu, Sonata in A minor, Op. 25; Schumann, Sonata No. 1 in A minor, Op. 105; Faure, Romance; and Saint-Saenz, Caprice.

Tickets for the general public are \$30, \$26, \$25; for union members & UW-Madison faculty/staff \$26 and \$25; UW-Madison students \$10 with a valid UW ID, youth: \$14 with purchase of adult ticket- limit 2 youth tickets per adult ticket. In the second concert, Goulding will be playing with the UW Chamber Orchestra on Saturday, November 5, 2011, 7:30 pm. The program includes Sinfonietta, op.1, by Benjamin Britten; Concerto for Violin in E minor, op. 64 by Felix Mendelssohn; and Symphony No. 2 in D major, op. 36 by Ludwig van Beethoven.

Tickets for the general public are \$16; for union members & UW-Madison faculty/staff \$12; UW Madison Students FREE with a valid UW ID, and youth tickets are \$12 with purchase of adult ticket - limit 2 youth tickets per adult ticket. special performer,” Pulitzer-prize winning composer John Corigliano said upon seeing Goulding play.

Critics agree that her personality-infused performances, impeccable technique, and fearless style have made her a serious force on the classical music scene. In 2009 she was awarded a Grammy nomination for her debut recording and recently she was awarded the coveted Avery Fischer Career Grant. Goulding has played with the Cleveland Orchestra, the Detroit Symphony, the Cleveland Pops Orchestra, the Cincinnati Pops, the Buffalo Philharmonic, Sinfonia Gulf Coast, Atlantic Classical Orchestra, and Louisville Youth Orchestra, among others.
